studies show how small improvements in physical activity -- two to five minutes or more of brisk walking -- and sleep and diet can meaningfully impact one's lifespan and reduce deaths in a population, offering a more feasible starting place for making healthy behavioural changes. An increase of five minutes of sleep, two minutes of brisk walking and an additional half a serving of vegetables per day could add a year of life for those with the worst sleep, physical activity and dietary habits, according to a new study

The research highlighted that the combined relationship of sleep, physical activity and diet is larger than the sum of the individual behaviours.



published in The Lancet's eClinicalMedicine journal. The findings suggest that when combined, small improvements in sleep, physical activity and diet could result in meaningful changes to lifespan, offering a sustainable, more feasible starting place for making

behavioural changes, an international team of researchers from the UK, Australia, Brazil and Chile said. The study defined the worst combination of behaviours as five-and-a-half hours of sleep per day, physical activity of under 10 minutes and a poor score in diet quality.

Saldana highest-grossing actor of all times

According to box office tracking website Numbers, which compiles worldwide data on the top 100 stars in leading roles, Saldana ranks first with a cumulative global box office collection of USD 15.46 billion from 33 films, averaging nearly USD 469 million per movie.


Kerala confirms participation in ISL

Unbeaten century against NZ

Rahul creates ODI history



India's dependable batter KL Rahul etched his name in the record books with a magnificent unbeaten century against New Zealand in the second match of the

ongoing ODI series at the Niranjan Shah Stadium in Rajkot on Wednesday, becoming the first Indian wicket-keeper to score a hundred against the Black Caps in the 50-over format. He is also the first Indian to score an ODI century in Rajkot. Rahul achieved the unique feat by sending Kyle Jamieson's full toss into the stands in the 49th over to bring up his eighth ODI cen-

tury. The wicketkeeper-batter from Karnataka reached his hundred in just 87 balls. The Indian star remained unbeaten on 112 as he hammered 11 fours and one six against the Black Caps. Coming to bat at number five, Rahul started slowly with six dot balls. He finally got off the mark on the seventh ball. As his nerves settled, he lost the support of his partner Virat Kohli.

Nikolas Nartey struck late to settle a breathless five-goal contest as VfB Stuttgart claimed a dramatic 3-2 home victory over Eintracht Frankfurt in the Bundesliga. Stuttgart entered the night full of confidence after having routed Bayer Leverkusen and made only one change, welcoming Ermedin Demirovic back into the

starting line-up for the first time since October. Eintracht, fresh from a high-scoring draw with Borussia Dortmund, were forced into several alterations and began with clear attacking intent. The visitors were rewarded inside five minutes when Rasmus Kristensen glanced home a header from Ritsu Doan's delivery to stun the home crowd.

Kohli is highest run-scorer



Indian batting stalwart Virat Kohli once again etched his name into the record books during the second One-day International (ODI) against New Zealand, becoming India's highest run-getter in the format against the Black Caps. Kohli needed just one run in the second ODI at the Niranjan Shah Stadium in Rajkot to go past Sachin Tendulkar's tally of 1,750 runs. Kohli achieved the feat by scoring a power-

packed boundary on his first ball of the innings against Kristian Clarke. Kohli has played 35 ODI matches against the Black Caps and scored 1,773 runs before getting dis-

missed for 23 in the 24th over, trying to release the pressure after a seven-over boundary drought in the ongoing match.
